



# History of Anamoose

In 1893, the Soo Line Railroad Company was expanding their line and hired many people to help them lay steel and ties. Among these people were many Chippewa Indians who often noticed a dog that roamed the area. In the native language, dog was "Animosh". The railroad president's daughter was given the honor of naming our town. She called it Anamoose after the dog.

From 1893-1897 the railroad expansion brought many settlers to the area which allowed numerous businesses to be established and prosper.

Stelow Lake by the town of Anamoose occupies a depression formed about 12,000 years ago when the glacier extracted a chunk of material, moved it as a single piece, and then set it down a tenth of a mile to the south east. The glaciers left behind many hill-hole combinations.

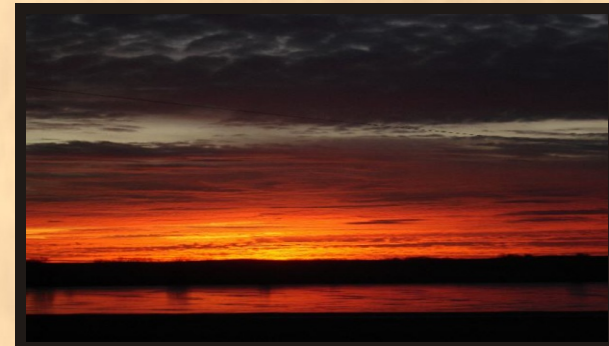
